

# Guidance Interview Frequently Asked Questions – Higher Education / Access / Supporting Teaching and Learning (Teaching Assistant) Courses

# What happens at the Guidance Interview?

All applicants for our Higher Education/Access courses, and a small number of other courses, eg Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools Certificate/Diploma must have a Guidance Interview in order to secure an offer prior to enrolment. You will have an appointment with a member of staff who teaches on your chosen course(s). They will check that the information you submitted on your application form is correct and talk to you about your predicted (or achieved) grades. You will be asked about your career aspirations, why you are interested in the course and what you already know about the subject area. This is also your opportunity to ask any questions that you might have. The Guidance Interview will take place on Campus but it may be possible to have a telephone interview if you are unable to attend in person.

# What should I do if I am not available for my Guidance Interview?

Please contact the Admissions Team as soon as possible using the contact details on your invite. We may be able to change the time of your interview or we will re-arrange your Guidance Interview.

# Where do I go when I arrive at the College for my Guidance Interview?

Please come in through our main entrance at the site indicated on your invite letter and report to Reception. Staff will be there to direct you to the relevant waiting area.

# Do I need to provide anything at the guidance interview?

If you have already completed qualifications, please have available your exam certificates, including GCSE Maths and English if achieved. You may be required to provide a copy via email. If you are unable to find them prior to the interview, advice will be given on how you can obtain duplicates (if required). You will also need a form of ID and evidence of any name change if applicable.

# How long will my Guidance Interview last?

The vast majority of interviews last approximately 15 minutes. If you have any queries regarding the duration of your interview, please contact the Admissions Team.

# I need more information about the course(s) I've chosen/entry requirements.

Please check our website for more information about your chosen course(s). Each course information sheet has a course summary, details of the entry requirements and information about what you can do next.

# Will I get any financial help whilst at College?

# How do I process my DBS required for my course?

You don't need to request your DBS yet; further information will be available before and during enrolment.

# What happens after my interview?

If you are offered a place on your chosen course(s), you will be informed during your Guidance Interview. We will confirm the offer in writing shortly afterwards. Enrolment information will be sent during the summer and we will keep in touch with you during the year.

# What if I've changed my mind about my course?

Please contact the Admissions Team as soon as possible using the contact details on your invite. We may be able to offer you an interview for the alternative course on the same date or we will re-arrange your interview for our next interview event. If you've already been offered a place on a chosen course, please do not re-apply, contact the Admissions Team for your relevant Campus to discuss the alternative course you are interested in.

# What if I no longer wish to consider Cheshire College - South & West

If you no longer wish to consider Cheshire College - South & West, please contact the Admissions Team for your relevant Campus and let us know the reason you are withdrawing your application.
